## Redeeming the Time – Are we investing or spending our lives?

"So teach us to number our days that we may gain a heart of wisdom." (Psalm 90:12)

"Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"—yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." (James 4:13-14)

- Given what we have covered in this series, consider the question...
  "Am I investing or spending the time and opportunities God has given me?"
   or put another way... "Am I making the most of opportunity or frittering away life in trivia and half-hearted service?"
- 2. Read Ephesians 5:15-16 Christians are to carefully observe how they live, that it be in wisdom. Put another way, Paul is commanding believers to walk [live] as wise men and women. Living wisely includes the idea of stewarding the time (opportunity) given to each of us.

This speaks to the imperative of investing our time on earth with a transcendent perspective, meaning, and significance in view. Our privilege of time and opportunity is limited. Using time well is a matter of "redeeming" the time and opportunities given.

- a. Wasting vice redeeming "best use of" Gk exagorazo; buying or redeeming
- b. Not foolish in evil days self destruction (Prov 14:1,8; 16:22; 19:3; Prov 9:13-18)
- c. But in wisdom "...Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom..." (1 Cor 1:30)
- d. Look carefully Gk Akribos accurately, circumspectly
- e. Understanding the will of the Lord basic principles found in scripture...
  - -To belong to Him through Jesus Christ (1 Tim 2:3-4)
  - -To be filled by the Spirit (Eph 5:18), letting the Word of Christ dwell richly (Col 3:16)
  - -To be sanctified (1 Thess 4:3) and submitted (1 Pet 2:13-15, Heb 13:17)
  - -To endure suffering (1 Pet 2:20-21, and be thankful (1 Thess 5:18)
